

Former Chaplain At Academy Named Minister In Bristol

The Rev. Richard T. Nolan, former Episcopal chaplain at Cheshire Academy, has been named minister-in-charge of Trinity Episcopal Church, Bristol, for the period September, 1968, through August, 1969.

In his third year as Sunday assistant minister and consultant in Christian Education of the 750-member parish, Mr. Nolan will assume the duties of the Rev. Russell L. Deragon, Rector of Trinity, while Father Deragon is on a year's leave of absence for clinical pastoral training at the Yale-New Haven Hospital.

The Rev. Nolan is on a one-year appointment as instructor in philosophy and education at Hartford Seminary Foundation, a graduate school of religious studies in Hartford. In addition, he is lecturer in philosophy at the Hartford Branch of the University of Connecticut and the University of Hartford.

During the Summer, the Episcopal clergyman will be visiting instructor of Oriental Religions at Trinity College, Hartford.

The newly organized Corpus Books, an affiliate of the World Publishing Company, has an-

nounced that in April a book edited by Mr. Nolan, "The Diaconate Now," will be published. A historical-theological study of the Christian diaconate, the volume was prepared with contributions from Roman Catholic, Orthodox, Protestant, and Anglican theologians resident in the United States, Ireland, India and Germany. Corpus Books is under the editorship of the Rev. Harold Gardiner, S.J., Ph.D., Roman Catholic scholar.

In addition to his Trinity Church post, Mr. Nolan will continue lecturing at the Hartford Branch of UConn and serve as lecturer in theology for a

semester at St. Joseph (Roman Catholic) College in West Hartford.

A graduate of Boston Latin School and Tabor Academy, the former Cheshire Academy faculty member earned a B.A. at Trinity College, B.D. at Hartford Seminary Foundation, M.A. in Religion at Yale, and is a Ph.D. candidate at New York University.
