

Religious Course Set For Branch

"Introduction to the History and Philosophy of Religion" will be taught at the Waterbury Branch of UConn Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 8:10 to 9:25 during the second semester by Richard T. Nolan, assistant dean of the Hartford Seminary Foundation.

The freshman-sophomore level course will survey the beliefs of major Oriental and Western Religions and the philosophical issues raised by them. Lectures, recordings, films and class discussions will be among the varied approaches to the subject.

A graduate of Trinity College, Dean Nolan studied philosophy and religion also at Hartford Seminary Foundation, Union Theological Seminary (N.Y.), Yale University and New York University. He has taught similar courses before at UConn as well as at University of Miami, Long Island University, and Trinity.

The editor of "The Diaconate Now," a book in historical theology published last May, Nolan is a member of the American Academy of Religion, American Philosophical Association, Religious Education Association and Phi Delta Kappa.

Registration for the course can be completed through the Branch Office on Hillside Avenue. Degree and unclassified students are eligible to enroll.
